TARGET TRACKER recommends that you periodically review and reinforce the information in this manual with younger OPERATORS, and that you inspect and maintain your children's TARGET TRACKER to insure their safety. The recommended OPERATOR age is 18 and older. Any OPERATOR unable to operate the TARGET TRACKER should not attempt to operate it. A parent's decision to allow his or her child to OPERATE this product should be based on the child's maturity, skill and ability to follow rules. Keep this product away from small children and remember that it is intended for use only by persons who are, at a minimum, completely comfortable and competent while operating the TARGET TRACKER. Do not attempt or do stunts or tricks on your TARGET TRACKER. The TARGET TRACKER is not made to withstand abuse from misuse such as jumping, curb grinding or any other type of stunts. Maintain a hold on the REMOTE CONTROL at all times. Never allow more than one person at a time to OPERATE the TARGET TRACKER. Never use near steps or swimming pools. Keep your fingers and other body parts away from the chain, steering system, wheels and all other moving components. Never use headphones or a cell phone when OPERATING. Never hitch a OPERATE with another TARGET TRACKER. Do not OPERATE your TARGET TRACKER in wet or icy weather and never immerse the TARGET TRACKER in water, as the electrical and drive components could be damaged by water or create other possibly unsafe conditions. The TARGET TRACKER is intended for use on flat, dry surfaces such as pavement or level ground without loose debris such as sand, leaves, rocks or gravel. Wet, slick, bumpy, uneven or rough surfaces may impair traction and contribute to possible accidents. Do not OPERATE your TARGET TRACKER in mud, ice, puddles or water. Avoid excessive speeds that can be associated with downhill operation. Never risk damaging surfaces such as carpet or flooring by use of an electric TARGET TRACKER indoors. Do not OPERATE at night or when visibility is limited. PROPER OPERATING ATTIRE Always wear proper protective equipment such as an approved safety helmet (with chin strap securely buckled), elbow pads and kneepads. Remove contents from box. Remove the foam separators that protect the components from damage during shipping. Inspect the contents of the box for scratches in the paint, dents or kinked cables that may have

occurred during shipping. Because the TARGET TRACKER was 95 percent assembled and packed at the factory, there

should not be any problems, even if the box has a few scars or dents.

MAKE SURE POWER SWITCH IS TURNED "OFF" BEFORE CONDUCTING ANY MAINTENANCE PROCEDURES.

Estimated Assembly and Set-Up Time TARGET TRACKER recommends assembly by an adult with experience in bicycle mechanics. Allow up to 20 minutes for assembly, not including initial charge time.

Therefore it is a good idea to charge the battery prior to use. · Initial charge time: 18 hours · Run time: Up to 40 minutes TO 6 HOURS of continuous OPERATE time · Recharge time: up to 12 hours · Average battery life: 250 charge/discharge cycles When the TARGET TRACKER is not in regular use, recharge the battery at least once a month until normal use is resumed. 2 Plug the charger into a wall outlet. If the lights on charger do not light up, check the power to the outlet. If necessary, try a different outlet. 1 Turn power **OFF** before charging. Plug the charger into the charger port on the electric TARGET TRACKER. Charger Charger Plug Charger Port Inflating the Tire The tires are inflated when shipped, but it invariably may lose some pressure between the point of manufacturing and your purchase. 1 Using a lawn implement style tire pump equipped for a Schrader type valve, inflate the front tire to the PSI indicated on the sidewall of the tire. Note: The pressurized air

supplies found at gasoline stations are designed to inflate high-volume automobile tires. If you decide to use such an air supply to inflate the tire, first make sure the pressure gauge is working, then use very short bursts to inflate to the correct PSI. If you inadvertently over-inflate the tire, release the excess pressure immediately. 2 Adjust the tension of the quick release to where you can close the lever all the way to secure the stem. 1 Open the quick release. (a) **Note:** Make sure the cables/ wires are out of the way before inserting the stem. WARNING: Failure to recharge the battery at least once a month may result in a battery that will no longer accept a charge. WARNING: Always disconnect your TARGET TRACKER from the charger before cleaning with liquid. Note: If your charger does not look like the one illustrated, your unit has been supplied with an alternative charger. The specifications and charging procedure would not change. The charger has a small window with one LED or two LEDs to indicate the charge status. Refer to the illustration on the charger unit for the actual "charging" and "charged" status indications for your model charger. Chargers have built-in overcharge protection to prevent battery from being over-charged. Charger will get warm during use. This is normal for some chargers and is no cause for

Safety Gear

Always wear proper protective gear such as an approved safety Always wear athletic shoes (lace-up shoes with rubber soles), never OPERATE barefooted or in sandals, and keep shoelaces tied and out of the way of the wheels, motor and drive system.

Battery

Make sure the power switch is turned off whenever the TARGET TRACKER is not in use. Never store the product in freezing or below freezing temperatures! Freezing will permanently damage the battery.

Brake

Check the Remote Control for proper function. When you squeeze the lever, the throttle should provide positive NO-braking action. When you apply the throttle with the speed control on, the brake cut-off switch should stop the motor. Make sure that brakes are not rubbing.

Frame, Front end and REMOTE CONTROL

Check for cracks or broken connections. Although broken frames are rare, it is possible for an aggressive OPERATOR to run into a curb or wall and wreck and bend or break a frame. Get in the habit of inspecting your TARGET TRACKER on a regular basis.

Tires

Periodically inspect the tires for excess wear, and regularly check the front tire pressure and re-inflate as necessary.

Turn power switch "OFF" before conducting any maintenance procedures. Adjusting the Chain Tools required:

1 Using wrenches, loosen the rear motor bolts by turning the wrenches counter clockwise. 2 Using a wrench, loosen the bolts on motor base Slide the motor to tighten chain tension. 4 bolts adjusters must be tightened the exact same amount to maintain

motor alignment. 3 Once the tension is correct, tighten the motor bolts. Test OPERATE the TARGET TRACKER. Readjust as needed. Note: This system of motor mount bolts is common. If you are not familiar with it or do not feel comfortable performing the adjustment, consult an authorized TARGET TRACKER service center or a qualified mechanic. The chain should be "just taut" - in other words snug, but not piano-wire tight. The tension should be similar to the fan chain on an automobile. BE CAREFUL NOT TO ADJUST TOO TIGHT. The tensioning system can easily impart too much tension and snap the chain or bend the motor shaft. Adjust 1/8 to 1/4 turn at a time and check the tension each time.

Tighten until they just barely hold the hardware in place. 7 Tighten both axle bolts and motor mount bolts the same number of turns to fine-tune the tension on the chain and center of the wheel. 8 Replace the Plastic Housing cover.

Battery Care and Disposal

Do not store the battery in temperatures above 75° or below -10° F. CONTAINS SEALED LEAD BATTERIES. BATTERIES MUST BE RECYCLED. A new battery should be charged for at least 18 hours before using the TARGET TRACKER for the first time and up to 1-12 hours after each subsequent use. Check all connectors. Make sure the charger connector is tightly plugged into the charging port, and that the charger is plugged into the wall. Make sure power flow to the wall outlet is on. Check all wires and connectors to make sure they are tight. The circuit breaker (next to on/off switch) will automatically shut off the power if the motor is overloaded. An excessive overload, such as too heavy a OPERATOR or too steep a hill, could cause the motor to overheat. If the TARGET TRACKER suddenly stops running, wait a few seconds and then resume operation. Correct the conditions that caused the motor to malfunction repeatedly overheating the motor. Charge the battery. A new battery should be charged for at least 18 hours before using the TARGET TRACKER for the first time and up to 12 hours after each subsequent use. Check all wires and connectors. Make sure the battery connector is tightly plugged into the charger connector, and that the charger is plugged into the wall. Make sure power flow to the wall outlet is on.

Even with proper care, a rechargeable battery does not last forever. Average battery life is 1 to 2 years depending on TARGET TRACKER use and conditions. Replace only with a TARGET TRACKER replacement battery or an identical battery found at a local battery supplier. 12 volt 7 ah

Use only on solid, flat, clean and dry surfaces such as pavement or level ground. It is intended for some off road situations but use common sense not to over stress frame and intended uses. The tire is inflated when shipped, but it invariably will lose some pressure between the point of manufacturing and your purchase. Refer to instructions on page 3 of this manual to properly inflate tire. Make sure you do not overload the TARGET TRACKER by allowing more than one OPERATOR at a time, exceeding the TARGET TRACKERs 250 pounds maximum weight limit, going up a hill or towing objects behind the TARGET TRACKER. If the TARGET TRACKER is overloaded, the motor may oveer heat may trip and shut off power to the motor. Correct the OPERATING conditions that caused the overload, wait a few seconds, and then try operation again. Avoid repeatedly overheating the motor and the circuit controller.

Sometimes the TARGET TRACKER doesn't run, but other times it does TARGET TRACKER makes loud noises or grinding sounds Problem Possible Cause Solution Loose wires or connectors Motor or electrical switch damage Chain is too dry Check all wires around the motors and all connectors to make sure they are tight. Contact your local TARGET TRACKER authorized service center for diagnosis and repair. Apply a lubricant such as 3 in 1TM or Tri-FlowTM to the chain.
